Southern Crescent Technical College (SCTC) is committed to providing an accurate informative annual report relating to crime statistics associated with its campuses and centers. The information provided within this report is available to the public and should be read carefully for content.

Southern Crescent Technical College’s Police/Security Officers

Southern Crescent Technical College and its *Police/Security Officers* strive to provide a safe and secure educational environment for *students, faculty, staff* and *others*. Professionally trained police/security officers are provided to accommodate any and all emergency, safety and security needs including conducting investigations and, if warranted, making arrests. If needed, SCTC has mutual aid agreements with local police agencies for additional assistance.

Southern Crescent Technical College adheres to and supports the “*20 USC © 1092(f) Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics*” also known as “*The Jeanne Clery Act.*” This law mandates that Colleges and Universities receiving Federal Student Financial Aid report on-campus crimes. Furthermore, this law requires information relating to crimes on campus to be readily available upon request to students, faculty, staff and others. *Southern Crescent Technical College* reports crime statistics *annually* in October to the U. S. Department of Education and maintains crime reports for a period of three years. A daily crime log is maintained and housed in the office of Student Affairs - Griffin Campus, the office of Student Affairs – Flint River Campus, the office of Facilities and Operations – Griffin campus, and the office of Police Chief – Griffin campus. At the Jasper County Center, the Butts County Center and the Taylor County Center, the daily crime log is located in the Administrative Office.

- **All emergencies – dial 911**

General Information

Southern Crescent Technical College's Law Enforcement staff is equipped to handle any and all emergencies that occur on campus. These include, but are not limited to, medical situations, domestic situations, student misconduct, and traffic flow. Officers located on the main campuses and/or centers are available for personal meetings with students, faculty, staff, or others that have a need for law enforcement or related advice. On-duty officers may be reached by calling 770-883-6032 (Griffin Campus) and 678-603-9077 (Flint River Campus) or by RADIO. Individuals may also report a crime by using the College's tip line - police@sctech.edu.

Campus Facility Access and Security

During business hours, the College will be open to students, parents, employees, contractors, guests, and invitees. During non-business hours, College access to all facilities is by key via campus police/security officers or maintenance.

After 10:30 p.m. on the Griffin and Flint River campuses, all access points are secure. This is accomplished by campus police/security and maintenance. During and after hours at SCTC centers, an appointed designee is responsible for securing the facilities. Southern Crescent Technical College does not maintain housing facilities.

Policy on Mandatory Reporting of Crimes

Students, faculty, staff, or others at Southern Crescent Technical College who have reasonable cause to believe that a person (student, staff member, etc.) has committed a crime on college property or at any college function should notify the *campus police/security officer, campus administrator* (in Student Affairs), or the first available *senior staff administrator* (Vice President level – *immediately*). Individuals may also report a crime by using the College's tip line - police@sctech.edu.

The following crimes must be reported under “*The Jeanne Clery Act.*”

1. Aggravated assault (involves body dismemberment or disfiguration).
2. Sexual offenses (including: rape, sodomy, assault, child molestation, statutory rape, public indecency, prostitution, pimping, pandering, and enticing a child for indecent purposes).
3. Carrying a deadly weapon at the College or any college event (deadly weapons include: explosive compounds, firearms, and knives designated for the purpose of offense and defense).
4. Possession, manufacture, distribution, or use of controlled substances or marijuana - except as legally authorized.
5. Threats to use fires or explosives to harm persons or property.
6. Damage to college property in excess value of \$50.

SCTC’s Chief of Police/designee shall make a report to the proper authorities after a proper investigation is conducted. Georgia law provides immunity from civil or criminal liability for those who make required reports in good faith and provide criminal sanctions for those who knowingly fail to make required reports.

Security Awareness

SCTC provides students and employees with information pertaining to security procedures, practices, and crime prevention tips on its web site (www.sctech.edu) under Student Services – Campus Resources – Campus Security. SCTC is currently expanding its security awareness programs for students and its employees.

Off Campus Locations – Student Organizations

SCTC does not have any officially recognized student organizations off campus.

Alcohol and Drug-Free Environment Statement

Southern Crescent Technical College recognizes that establishing an alcohol and drug-free environment encourages student and employee productivity and promotes the accomplishment of the College’s mission and goals.

In accordance, the following is declared:

1. The unlawful sale and/or possession of illicit drugs and/or alcohol are wrong.
2. Standards of conduct prohibit the unlawful possession, use, manufacture, distribution, or dispensation of illicit drugs and/or alcohol by students or staff on school premises, in route to and from the College, or as a part of any college sponsored activity.

3. Disciplinary action as outlined by the Student Handbook will apply to students. Information about drug and alcohol counseling, rehabilitation, and re-entry programs is available through the Student Affairs Division.
4. SCTC's campus Police Department enforces all Federal and Georgia State Laws pertaining to the sale, possession, and/or distribution of illicit drugs and/or alcohol.

Drug and Alcohol Prevention Programs

SCTC has developed a program to prevent the illicit use of drugs and the abuse of alcohol by students and employees. This program is offered on an annual basis and is sponsored by Student Affairs.

Health Emergency Procedures

In case of a health emergency, the following actions should be followed:

1. Notify Southern Crescent Technical College's (SCTC) *campus police/security officer, campus administrator* (in Student Affairs), or the first available *senior staff administrator* (Vice President Level – *immediately*) of the medical emergency.
2. **Dial 911** – Call for Emergency/Ambulance assistance if such action is warranted and then notify appropriate administrators.
3. If the situation is not life threatening, or in the opinion of the administrator, the person with the emergency can make rational decisions, appropriate action will be taken in conjunction with the victim's consent.

NOTE: If there is a life threatening situation, the first staff member on the scene should take immediate action as necessary.

Students or their parents will be responsible for the emergency and/or hospital expense if they are injured while attending the College or in clinical areas. Students are encouraged to purchase student accident insurance; details are available through the College's Business Office.

Emergency Evacuation and Procedures

1. General: Organization for Emergency Situations

A. Concept:

The Admissions Office will be used for all campuses and centers as the **Emergency Control Center (ECC)**, the central location from which to manage an emergency situation. If an incident occurs in the Admissions Office, then the Academic Affairs Office will be used. Several factors make the Admissions Office the best *central location* due to multiple phone lines, available personnel, inside and outside entrances, two-way radios, and a weather warning radio. (*see: Section 2. Communications and Notifications*)

B. Emergency:

An “**EMERGENCY**” is an extraordinary unanticipated situation where a real or implied risk to person(s) or property because of accidental, environmental, or human initiated events. The guiding principles regarding action to take in an emergency situation are:

1. Preserve life
2. Preserve and protect the surrounding area (to facilitate later investigation)
3. Control access to the vicinity of the emergency
4. Guide emergency personnel or law enforcement personnel to the scene

C. Emergency Situation:

All emergency situations on campus should be reported *immediately* to the *campus police/security officer, campus administrator* (in Student Affairs), and the President or the first available *senior staff administrator* (Vice President Level – *immediately*). If law enforcement assistance or other outside assistance is needed, use the two-way radio to contact police/security officers, or call 770-883-6032 for police/security on the Griffin Campus, or 678-603-9077 for police/security on the Flint River Campus. Conduct a “credibility assessment” of the situation reported, decide what action to take, and if management for the incident over a period of time is required, then activate the Emergency Control Center (ECC).

On an annual basis, SCTC activates its emergency/evacuation procedures. On April 22, 2011, a mock “Active Shooter Exercise” was conducted on the Griffin campus which included all local first responder agencies from the area. A log of all campus drills is maintained in the office of the Chief of Police.

D. Activated Emergency Control Center (ECC):

The following actions shall be taken when an emergency situation arises of such magnitude that the emergency control center is activated. The decision to activate the control center is made by the President and/or Vice President for Facilities and Operations.

1. Call 911
2. Close the door to student traffic, limit access to the Admissions Office
3. Summon the following personnel to the ECC:
 - a) President and Senior Management Team
 - b) Maintenance Supervisor

c) Marketing Director/Public Information Officer

d) SCTC Chief of Police/Officer on Duty/Security Officer/Designee

E. Outside Assistance:

Call 911 to notify the County Sheriff's Department. The Sheriff's Department is the conduit through which to obtain medical evacuation, fire department, or to reinforce law enforcement.

2. Communications and Notifications

A. General:

In an emergency, the first priority is to deal with the situation appropriately and then report the emergency to Student Affairs.

SCTC's Marketing Director is responsible for disseminating emergency information to the larger community.

B. Two-way Radios: Strategically Placed Throughout the Campus:

Maintenance personnel, Deputy Sheriffs, and SCTC's Police/Security Officers on campus all carry a two-way radio.

C. Computer Network:

Instruct the Information Systems Department to disseminate a message visible on the monitor of every computer logged into the College's network. (*Or, if possible, send an email to a pre-arranged message group.*)

If a continuous ringing of a fire alarm or a Civil Defense weather siren sounds, everyone should evacuate immediately using the designated emergency exit routes as posted in each area/room. Further information will be provided by SCTC's Police Officers/Security Officers or Administrators.

3. Crime Alert Timely Warnings

In the event that a situation arises, either on or off a campus/center, that, in the judgment of the President/designee, constitutes an ongoing or continuing threat, a campus wide "timely warning" will be issued. Unless the notification will, in the professional judgment of responsible authorities, compromise efforts to assist victims or to contain, respond to, or otherwise mitigate the emergency. The warning will be issued through the college e-mail system to all students, faculty, and staff. Additionally, a message will be sent out on "*calling post*" phone tree system. All this will be accomplished by the Information Systems Department.

SCTC will test its emergency response and evacuation procedures at least once on an annual basis on each campus/center.

Sex Offender Registry and Access to Related Information

The Federal Campus Sex Crimes Act, enacted on October 28, 2000, became effective on October 28, 2002. This law mandates that institutions of higher education issue a statement advising the campus community where sex offender information provided by a state may be obtained. Procedures and Programs Related to Sex Offenses

Campus disciplinary proceedings for an alleged sex offense will be handled by the Vice President of Student Affairs. The accuser and the accused are entitled to the same opportunities to have others present during a disciplinary proceeding both the accuser and accused will be informed of the outcome of any institutional disciplinary proceeding that is brought alleging a sex offense. Compliance with this paragraph does not constitute a violation of the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). The outcome of a disciplinary proceeding means only the institutions final determination with respect to the alleged sex offense and any sanction that is imposed against the accused. A student found guilty of violating SCTC's sexual misconduct policy could be criminally prosecuted in state courts and maybe suspended or expelled from our institution.

Currently, SCTC directs students, faculty, and staff to links that provide educational materials concerning rape awareness, acquaintance rape, and forcible and non-forcible sex offenses. We are also in the process of creating a class for the campus community to attend relating to sex offenses and reporting procedures.

If you are a victim of a sexual assault at this institution, your first priority should be to get to a place of safety. You should then obtain necessary medical treatment. SCTC's Police Department strongly advocates that a victim of sexual assault report the incident in a timely manner. Time is a critical factor for evidence collection and preservation. An assault should be reported directly to a SCTC officer and/or to a member of administration. Filing a police report with a campus officer will not obligate the victim to prosecute, nor will it subject the victim to scrutiny or judgmental opinions from officers. Filing a police report will:

1. Ensure that a victim of sexual assault receives the necessary medical treatment and tests;
2. Provide the opportunity for collection of evidence helpful in prosecution, which cannot be obtained later (ideally a victim of sexual assault should not wash, douche, use the toilet, or change clothing prior to a medical/legal exam);
3. Assure the victim has access to confidential counseling from counselors specifically trained in the area of sexual assault crisis intervention.

SCTC will assist students, faculty, and staff with notifying the proper authorities concerning any and all sex offenses. SCTC's Equity Coordinator will assist victims with the process and refer them to an off-campus counseling service: ***Promise Place*** – promiseplace.org - 770.692-3333. If at all possible, SCTC will adjust/modify your academic schedule to accommodate a victims needs following an alleged sex offense.

Victims of Crimes, Violence, and/or Non-forcible Sex Offenses

Southern Crescent Technical College will, upon written request, disclose to the alleged victim of a crime of violence, or a non-forcible sex offense, the results of any disciplinary hearing conducted by the College against the student who is the alleged perpetrator of the crime or offense. If the alleged victim is deceased as a result of the crime or offense, SCTC will provide the results of the disciplinary hearing to the victim's next of kin, if so requested.

Annual Disclosure of Crime Statistics

The SCTC campus police prepare these reports to comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act. The full text of this report can be located on Southern Crescent Technical College's web site - www.sctech.edu. This report is prepared in cooperation with the local law enforcement agencies surrounding our main campuses/centers and other divisions that receives information concerning crimes.

Each year, an e-mail notification is sent to all students, faculty, and staff providing the web site to access the Annual Security Report. Copies of the report may also be obtained from the Facilities and Operations Department.
