Tender Tech Child Development Center Receives Quality Rating

Southern Crescent Technical College is proud to announce that Tender Tech Child Development Center, located on the Flint River Campus in Thomaston, has recently reaffirmed their 2-star Quality Rating with the Georgia Department of Early Care and Learning Bright From the Start.

Quality Rated is a tiered quality rating and improvement system used to assess, improve, and communicate the level of quality in early and school-age care and education programs. Similar to rating systems for other service-related industries like hotels and restaurants, Quality Rated assigns a quality rating to early and school-age care and education programs that meet a set of defined program standards. These ratings allow caregivers an avenue to easily identify high-quailty child care and early education programs that are using research-based best practices to prepare children for school and life.

Tender Tech is more than just a daycare; it's a nurturing haven for children aged 6 weeks to 12 years old. Open to the public as well as SCTC students, Tender Tech teaches children using a hands-on approach to learning with appropriate assessment of each individual child. Recently, Tender Tech's classrooms and playgrounds have been upgraded with state-of-the-art equipment, comfortable furniture, and engaging learning tools to enhance each child's learning experience.

With an extensive array of dynamic programs, Tender Tech strives to meet the diverse needs of local families. From our esteemed Georgia Pre-K initiative, giving eager minds a head start on their educational journey, to our convenient before and after-school program, ensuring seamless transitions for our school-aged children to and from Upson-Lee Elementary, Tender Tech has a childcare option for every family. In addition, Tender Tech offers full-day childcare camps that provide



an opportunity for fun-filled discovery and learning that are offered during each school break with an extended program during the summer.

Tender Tech offers grants to help with child care costs for parents who meet specific criteria. Tender Tech also accepts CAPS (Children and Parents Support) from Bright from the Start and is a part of the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) which provides reimbursement for meals served to children. sctech.edu/TenderTech

ABOUT THE SCTC FOUNDATION

The Southern Crescent Technical College Foundation, Inc. is a non-profit organization organized under Georgia state law that provides guidance and helps secure funding for Southern Crescent Technical College. The Foundation is governed by a local board of trustees who represent positive leadership and community influence throughout the College's eight-county service area of Butts, Fayette, Henry, Jasper, Lamar, Pike, Spalding, and Upson. By serving as advisors in the advancement of the College, the Board of Trustees plans and implements resource development activities to improve programs and recognition for Southern Crescent Technical College.

In collaboration with SCTC's Vice President for Advancement, the Foundation plans and hosts special events and fundraisers to benefit the College and students including the Drive "Fore" Education Invitational Golf Tournament, the Food and Wine Pairings Event, and the Internal Campaign which provides scholarships for students from SCTC Faculty and Staff payroll deductions. Additionally, the Foundation solicits and reappropriates funds from external stakeholders for scholarships and other monetary donations to the College and its programs.

The Foundation is important because it provides Southern Crescent Technical College with the financial support needed to grow. The tie that binds the College and the Foundation is that the Foundation recognizes the unmet need for funding available to technical education.

The Southern Crescent Technical College Foundation, Inc., is fiscally and organizationally separate from the College. Its purpose is to receive private gifts, bequests, and donations and to account for, manage, and help appreciate monies or property submitted to the Foundation. The Foundation also exists to improve the image and expand community awareness of Southern Crescent Technical College. The Foundation's mission, goals, and objectives are consistent with the philosophy, purpose, and strategic plan of the College.

The Southern Crescent Technical College Foundation, Inc., is incorporated under Georgia Law and is financially and organizationally separate from the College. It is classified as a 501(c) (3) organization under the Internal Revenue Code and gifts received may be tax deductible.
