SCTC Rolls Out New First Year Experience Course for Students

Southern Crescent Technical College (SCTC) is dedicated to guiding students toward academic excellence while fostering their active involvement as valuable contributors to both the community and the workforce. In higher education, the first year of college sets the tone for student success yet, first-semester and first-year college students possess a heightened risk of academic failure and non-persistence.

In an attempt to promote student success, counter academic failure and improve persistence and retention rates, SCTC is introducing a new initiative called FYE of the Tiger. This initiative aims to enhance the first-year experience (FYE) for contemporary students, focusing on career readiness and skills development throughout their first year at SCTC.

FYE of the Tiger is a comprehensive program designed to support students during their crucial first year of college. It offers a transformative experience that goes beyond academics to prepare students for their future careers.

Starting before their coursework begins at SCTC, students will be introduced to FYE of the Tiger.

From there, a systematic approach will be taken to transform a student's first-year experience through an innovative online module-based sequence designed to promote student success. Students will have access to carefully designed modules that allow them to connect to college personnel, resources, programs, policies, events and procedures that will allow them to thrive in their new environment.

Through the use of academic strategies, technology, and self-discovery, students will develop the crucial skills necessary to be successful. As a result, FYE of the Tiger will enhance career opportunities, cultivate job-related skills, and prepare students for upward mobility inside and outside of the college setting. These modules will be an integral part of students' first-year curriculum, equipping students with the skills necessary for success in both college and the workforce.

Mercado Sworn-In as SCTC Police Chief



During a recent ceremony, Lemuel Mercado was officially sworn in by Superior Court Judge Ben Coker as Southern Crescent Technical College's Chief of Campus Safety and Security. Chief Mercado's law enforcement career spans three decades and includes work with Florida's Polk County Sheriff's Office and locally with the Griffin Police Department.

For the past 15 years, Chief Mercado has been employed by Southern Crescent Technical College teaching Criminal Justice courses and most recently serving as the Dean of Public Safety, Industrial, and Film Technologies. Throughout his tenure at SCTC, he has maintained his P.O.S.T. certification and assisted SCTC's Police Department with various activities. During his active law enforcement career, he served as a detention deputy, juvenile boot camp drill instructor, shift sergeant and supervisor of the

Uniform Patrol Division, Crimes Against Property Investigator in the Criminal Investigation Unit, and as the lieutenant over the Juvenile Division. Chief Mercado spent the majority of his law enforcement career as a supervising officer. His previous experience also includes serving as a sergeant in the United States Army in Central America and Colorado.

Southern Crescent Technical College operates a state-accredited independent law enforcement agency which offers the highest degree of safety and security for students, faculty, staff, and visitors. The SCTC Police Department, led by the Chief of Campus Safety and Security, provides basic patrol functions and has all powers which are afforded to law enforcement agencies of the state of Georgia. All officers that work for SCTC are P.O.S.T. certified with state granted powers of arrest and have authorized jurisdiction to enforce the laws of the state of Georgia. All officers are sworn to defend the Constitution of the United States, the Constitution of the State of Georgia, and the laws and ordinances of the jurisdiction.

Chief Mercado is a graduate of Mercer University with a Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice and Columbus State University with a Master's Degree in Public Administration. Additionally, Chief Mercado also graduated from the Georgia Chief of Police Association Command College and Professional Management Programs. sctech.edu/ChiefMercado
